Community Representatives

Graeme Hill – Previously I had raised my concerns with the Member for Griffith that regardless of current and future efforts to inform the public of the impending impacts a second runway would have on the communities of Brisbane, it would appear that the silent majority are simply not interested unless it directly impacts their lives today and that a wave of discontent could be expected once the new runway becomes operational. Whilst 'COVID' has greatly reduced aircraft movements the wave of discontent has arrived at our doorstep, especially in the Hawthorne, Bulimba and Balmoral areas.

I have recently had initial, brief discussions with a Dr Sean Foley (resident of Balmoral) who has raised some relevant points that I believe warrant further effort on my behalf to become more informed and educated. It is my intention to inform today's meeting that I will be meeting with Dr Foley and a select community discussion group to further consider the relevance of the documents put forward to myself and highlight all reasonable questions that may arise from said documents and future discussions and seek clarification from my fellow BACACG members and/or other relevant stakeholders.

Current Points of Discussion:

- Air Services publication relevant to Environmental Principles & Procedures for minimising the impact of Aircraft noise.
- Airspace architecture, Arrivals & Departures
- Glide path ratios/rate of descent
- Current Operational Adherence:
 - Airline & Pilot accountability
 - Effective Noise Monitoring:
 - Fixed & mobile units
 - Real time reporting (not delayed) and made available to the public

As Brisbane is a city without an airport curfew, it is even more paramount that we listen to the communities that we represent and work together to maximise our efforts to ensure residents are not adversely disadvantaged or disturbed.

As the representative for the Federal Seat of Griffith on this committee I shall keep BACACG informed (and the Member) of my dealings and any outcomes/actions required.

Now that the second runway is operational it is important to uphold the principles and values that are enshrined in the seat which I fill on this committee and to work together to foster a one team policy and; most importantly, to keep the trust of our communities and to act with empathy and a sense of conscience

Milan Pavasovic - No concerns with the flight paths/ new runway, only disappointment was the open day a lot of people was looking forward to it . People are now focusing on the recovery. Small business have taken big hit and waiting on border restriction to ease and planes to start flying so we can trade and make more money

Steven Ware – There was a few concerns with property prices which was easy answered. Our main concern now is job security and what is going to happen, there is a building minority who are increasing worried about the economic effects of the contained close down of the airport. That fear is starting to take hold within the community.

Jim Nyland - Universities have been impacted with the grounding of aircrafts and no international travel. 100s of jobs to be lost with in the educational sector. Looking forward on next steps and how we can support each other.
